

World Language Course Taking: Using Regression Analysis (controlling for background and achievement differences) to reveal the impact of number and type of World Language courses taken



Relative to taking 1 course, students who took 2, 3, or 4 WL courses finished their degrees 1-2 weeks faster

SEMESTERS TO

Relative to taking 1 course, students who took 2 WL courses had a slightly increased GPA at degree (.01)



Relative to taking 1 course, students who took 5+ WL courses earned 2.63 more credit hours upon graduation
